Associate Membership contribution to the SEAMEO Secretariat

Associate Membership contribution to the SEAMEO Secretariat is an annual contribution from each SEAMEO Associate Member in compliance with the SEAMEO Charter as stated on page 10 under Appendix "Terms and Conditions of Associate Membership and Affiliate Membership of SEAMEO" as follow:

"6. An Associate Member shall make an annual financial contribution to the organization, the amount of which shall be fixed by council."

The funds received from all SEAMEO Associate Members for this component will be lumped together and be utilized in line with the guidelines as adopted by the council as its 9th SEAMEC Conference, In-Camera Session as well as the additional guidelines as approved by the Council at its 18th SEAMEC conference in Penang, Malaysia. The said guidelines are as follows:

- 9th SEAMEC Conference, In-Camera Session resolutions:
 1. To cover additional expenses arising from liaison work with Associate Member,
 2. To meet the costs of certain unbudgeted activities for which, normally, special grants are sought by the Secretariat,
 3. To supplement the costs of promotional activities such as fund-raising and publication.
- 18th SEAMEC Conference resolution:
 4. To support specific regular programmes and activities of Centres and Projects for which Special funds are not available or adequate.
 5. To support special programmes or activities of the organization, subject to prior acceptance of the Associate Members.

The utilization of Associate Membership contributions to the SEAMEO Secretariat will be reported annually first to the High Officials Meeting and then to the council for acknowledgement.

Request

The Government of Spain's Annual Associate Membership Contribution to the SEAMEO is in the amount of Euro 6,000.

SEAMEO Educational Development Fund (SEDF)

The SEDF has been established to serve as a repository for gifts to support the requirements of Special Funds and Other Funds as follows:

1. Support of Special Funds Requirements, which cover nine items, namely:

Training and Research Scholarships
Seminars and Special Conferences
Personnel Exchange
Governing Board Meetings
Research Fellowship and Grants
Project Feasibility Studies
SEAMEO Students Exchange programme
Research and Development (R&D) Projects in Education, Science and Culture
Annual Awards given by SEAMEO-Donors to outstanding personnel in various categories in the fields of Education, Science and Culture in Southeast Asia.

2. Support of the Other Funds requirements, which cover SEAMEO's specific activities that are not subsidized by SEAMEO Regular Operational Budgets and Special Fund.

The allocation of SEDF has been done by the SEAMEO Secretariat in its role as SEAMEO Headquarters to meet the annual Special Funds requirements of the SEAMEO Centres as approved by the Council. The principles for allocation of SEDF to meet Special Funds requirements of the SEAMEO Centres are as follow:

1. SEDF (Tied Funds) are first allocated to all SEAMEO Centres in line with terms and conditions laid down by Donors and stipulated by the MOUs;
2. SEDF (Untied Funds) contributed by all Donors will be lumped together and allocated to meet four components of Special Funds requirements (Training and Research Scholarship, Seminars and Conferences, Governing Board Meetings and Personal Exchange) after being met by Tied funds. This remaining portion of Special Funds requirements will also be determine the proportion of Untied Funds which each Centre is entitled to receive. The prioritization for allocation of SEDF (Untied Funds) to each component of Special Funds is ranked by each SEAMEO Centre. These Guidelines were approved by the Council at its 40th Conference In-camera session, in Vietnam 2005.

Similarly, the allocation of the SEDF to support the requirements of Other Funds can be done to all SEAMEO specific programmes and projects. The requirements of Other Funds, however, shall involve individual specific project/ activities, may last a longer period of time and need a bigger amount of budget.

The SEAMEO Educational Development Fund constituted by the contributions from Member Countries, Associate Members and Donors is considered as the life-blood of the Organization. Without the SEDF, all regular programmes and activities under Five-Year Development Plan and other initiative projects of SEAMEO Centres and no longer be implemented. The major donors are SEAMEO Associate Members, SEAMEO Member Countries at this stage, even those which attained a certain degree of economic growth, still have not achieved self-reliance by contributing to support its own participants. Therefore, the contributions from Associate Members to the SEDF are essentially needed, especially for the implementation of regular programme under Centre's Five-Year Development Plan as well as other SEAMEO initiatives.

The Government of Associate Member Country's contribution to the SEDF is on voluntary basis.
